This years connercial jack harvest, carried out by the Subine make Indian pund, started on august 4, 1978 and terminated on August 20, 1976. With a total of 48,273 jacks being caught and delivered to successful bidder, McMillan Fishing Company of Frince Rupert, B.C. (R. Leasont 1978 report)

Perpendures remained low with the highest temperature in July of 24.3°C. However there were six (6) frost free months during 1975 which is believed to be a record as it is normal to have frost each month of the year in Smithers. In late October and early november heavy rains covered the area bringing some rivers to flood conditions, however there was major durage to only the Telksa Hiver, road and bridge, and light damage to a few minor streams.
